

Stories of Faith in Action

On November 5th, members of Christ the King Lutheran in Ellendale gathered after worship to make cards for migrants who will be in detention centers during the Christmas season. Joan Hoffman coordinated the card making and had bilingual greetings prepared for the card makers. Cards will all be sent together for distribution..

Fourteen people listened to Deb Elhard offer a description of the US-Mexican boarder from her recent trip to Tucson and Nogales. She described the forprofit detention centers that house migrants as well as groups that provide humanitarian support to people in need on their journey. Physical safety from violence and cartels are a major contributor to the decision to seek a new life. These people can claim asylum to escape the threats to their lives, but the process can be long and uncertain. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS) coordinates the program that gives cards to immigrants. Sometimes families are split apart as they flee for their safety, sometimes parents don't survive the journey, and sometimes children flee alone. LIRS pays particular attention to providing a safe and welcoming environment for unaccompanied children detained in immigration centers. LIRS operates Welcome Centers to ensure that asylum seekers and refugees have access to local services and support.

Advent begins on December 3rd this year. Members of the partner congregations have written reflections for each day from December 3 (First Sunday of Advent) to January 6 (Epiphany.) Each congregation will make copies to distribute to members and friends. An electronic version of this daily devotional is also available on NDChristiansAct.org for anyone to read.

Each week of Advent and the week of Christmas leading to Epiphany will have a theme.

Keep Awake! What are you watching for? Do Not be Afraid! What do you need to stop fearing? Prepare! What are you preparing for? My Soul Magnifies the Lord! What are you praising God for? Rejoice! What Are You Hopeful For?

Each day will include a Bible verse and a reflection.

May this devotional resource be a welcome companion for you throughout this season.
