Mission Trip Opportunity for Junior & Senior High Youth

2023 marks the 100th anniversary of Lutheran mission in the Sudan (present day Cameroon & Central African Republic). A celebration will take place July 8-9, 2023 in Minneapolis and will include representatives from Cameroon and the CAR, as well as US and Canadian synod bishops. As part of the centennial celebration, youth groups are invited to participate in a Global Mission Trip in Minneapolis! Groups will spend a few days learning about urban ministry in Minneapolis and then participate in the Centennial Celebration. If you know a Jr. or Sr. High student who is interested in being a part of this learning opportunity contact your pastor!

Christians in Action – Inviting a Pastoral Intern

One strength of the Christians in Action Partnership is the variety of experiences our congregations provide for future pastors to learn about serving in rural communities. Together, we have applied to become an internship site for a pastoral intern during the 2023-2024 academic year.

At Annual Meetings in January, both Emmanuel in Gackle and Trinity in Jamestown voted to proceed with an application to Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (PLTS) for an intern. The proposal in our application is for the intern to live in the parsonage in Gackle and serve 15 hours per week as part of ministry with Emmanuel Lutheran Church. Pastor Kristi Weber would serve as the intern supervisor and the intern would serve 10 hours per week as part of ministry with Trinity Lutheran in Jamestown. A third congregation would be served by the intern for Sunday worship twice a month and have one half day per week of ministry in that community. Montpelier Lutheran will decide in the coming weeks if they wish to be that third internship partner.

The remaining 10 hours each week would be spent wherever it makes the most sense for the particular learning goals at the time. For example, leading a weekly Bible study for one congregation might be part of a six to eight week experience at some point during the year. Participation in weekly text study with other pastors might take place in Jamestown. The learning needs and interests of the intern will influence the actual schedule for this full time position.

The anticipated timeline for the internship process to unfold looks like this:

October 2022 – The Intent to Apply for an Intern form was sent to PLTS after discussion among the Christians in Action Local Coordinators and among the Councils at Trinity and Emmanuel.

January 2023 – The Eastern North Dakota Synod Endowment Committee voted to award a grant of \$15,000 to support the Christians in Action Partnership in hosting an intern.

January 2023 – Emmanuel in Gackle and Trinity in Jamestown voted to apply to host an intern.

Spring 2023 – The seminary will match available interns with internship sites.

Late Spring/Early Summer – An internship committee of 2 members from each of the 3 primary congregations partnering for the internship will be formed to prepare for the arrival of the intern.

Late Summer/Early Fall – The intern will arrive to begin learning and serving in our communities.

12 Month Internship – Throughout the year, the internship committee will meet with the intern to provide feedback on the learning goals that the intern is working toward. The intern and supervisor will meet weekly. The congregations will have a variety of opportunities to meet and work with the intern on Sundays and during the week during the year.

- -usher list to be reinstated


New Business

- -The council will construct a formal parsonage agreement with Pastor Stephanie.
- -The council reviewed the annual budget and made necessary changes that will be presented at the annual meeting.
- -Annual meeting to be held on January 29, 2023 after the 11:00 service. Council member terms that expire are Michelle Lytle, Brenda Guthmiller, and Karen Heinle.

Meeting adjourned after the Lord's Prayer.
