#### **Epiphany Reflections**

"Even the darkest night will end and the sun will rise." Victor Hugo, Les Miserables

January always seems like the darkest month to me. The days are short and long cold nights of winter stretch out before us. Unlike November and December there aren't gatherings to prepare for, friends and family to gather with. Winter in North Dakota in January seems to drag on and on and spring feels far away.

Of course it isn't true that January is the darkest month. The longest night of the year is December 21st, so in January the light is gaining strength every day. Each day is a little longer and each night a little shorter. This is the good news we need when the dark threatens to overtake us. It's a good time to remember what is written in the Gospel of John, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

In January when the light is gaining strength every day we also encounter Epiphany and the season following. Epiphany always falls on January 6th, thirteen days after Christmas. It is the official end of the Christmas season in the church. Epiphany commemorates the coming of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. It is the day we celebrate that the light has come, not just for the people of Israel, but for all people. As the prophet Isaiah promised, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them light has shined."

As we face the long cold days of January, may we find the season of Epiphany a comfort and a source of hope. A reminder that Jesus continues to reveal himself to us. A reminder that the light has come into the world, and the darkness will not overcome it. Perhaps Epiphany and the season after are not just a time of encouragement when the days are cold and dark but whenever we are discouraged by the realities of this world that seem insurmountable. When we are lonely, sick, fearful, tired or discouraged may we be encouraged by the light of Christ. The light that comes into the world to banish the darkness and offer us the light of hope, forgiveness, and at the last resurrection.

#### Discernment Process among South Central North Dakota ELCA Congregations

The focus of the first meeting of the Area Ministry Planning Team was building a foundation for working together. This included introductions of team members, a review of the situation(s) that bring individual congregations into the process, what a successful project might look and feel like, and sharing those critical things within individual congregations that help hold the community together.

Pr. Peter Soli from Dialog Works, with assistance from the Rev. Dr. Scott Olson, facilitated the meeting. Pr. Keith Zeh, interim Director of Evangelical Mission for the EAND Synod, brought a greeting offered the opening devotion. He spoke to having two groups in the meeting, the selected congregational representatives and several pastors and pastoral leaders. Pr. Soli explained that the group would make decisions using a consensus-building process rather than voting. He indicated that the role of pastors and leaders would be limited to observation and as a source of information. Otherwise, they would not be full participants in the discussions.

The team was introduced to an online tool called MURAL. This tool will be used throughout the process and allow team members to participate between meetings and review the group's work from previous meetings.

Making decisions was not a primary goal of this first meeting, instead of for the group to engage in positive and encouraging ways.

Team members began to identify the situation in their congregations and what brought them to the table. Individual congregations lifted up some of the following as the project's "Givens."

- staffing challenges and the challenge of securing pastoral leadership
- being in transition
- transitioning out of COVID
- people worshiping online and what that means
- we are aging and finding children's ministry a blessing and challenge
- we are already working together and have a shared future
- we serve the community—a vital ministry

The team will develop a list of commitments they want to make and the process. They will also begin to identify areas for action, exploration, and, given their situation, where they want to focus their energy.
